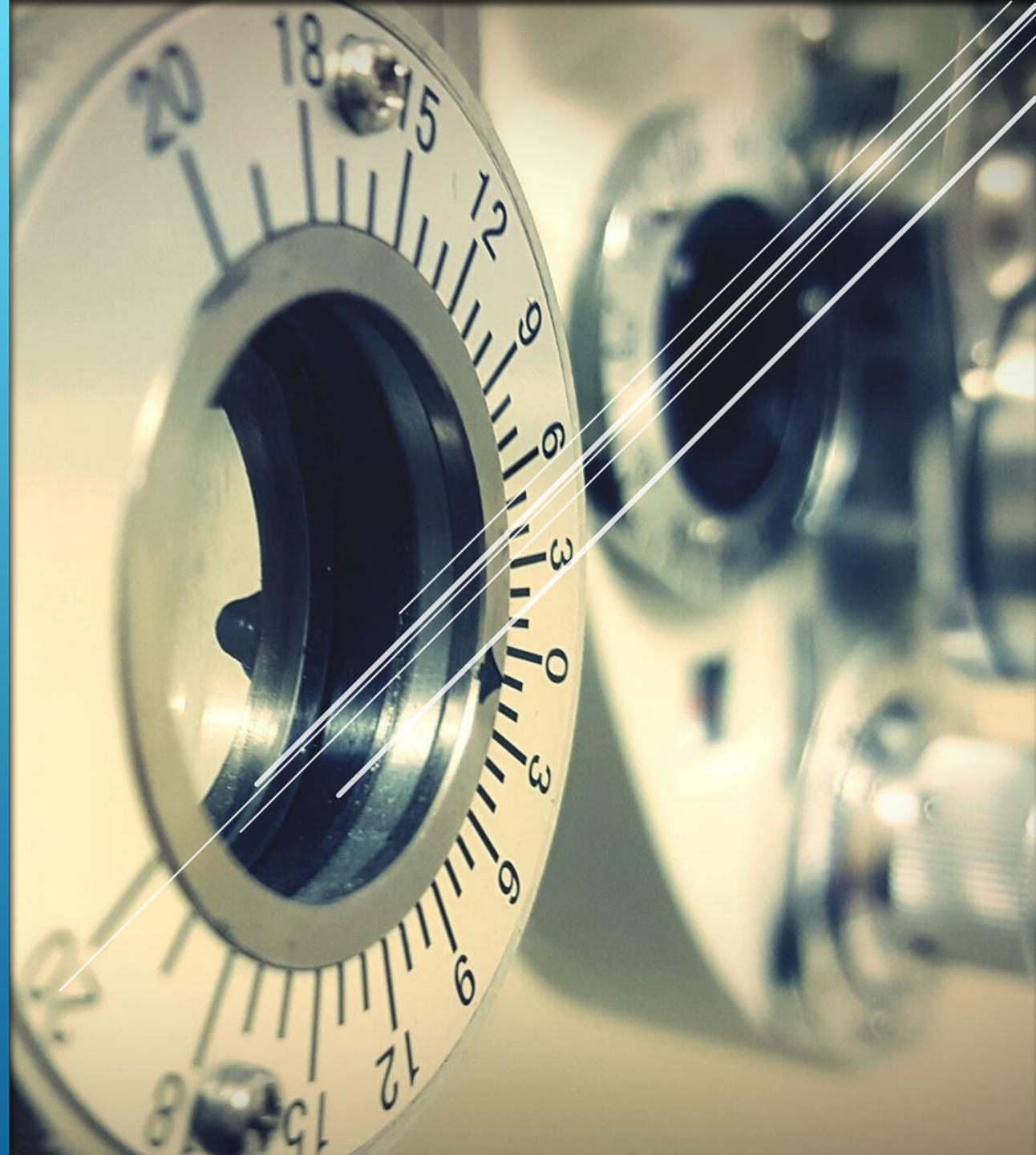


CHAPTER 13 - CAMERA DIAL

- ▶ All these scenes will be explained further in a later chapter.

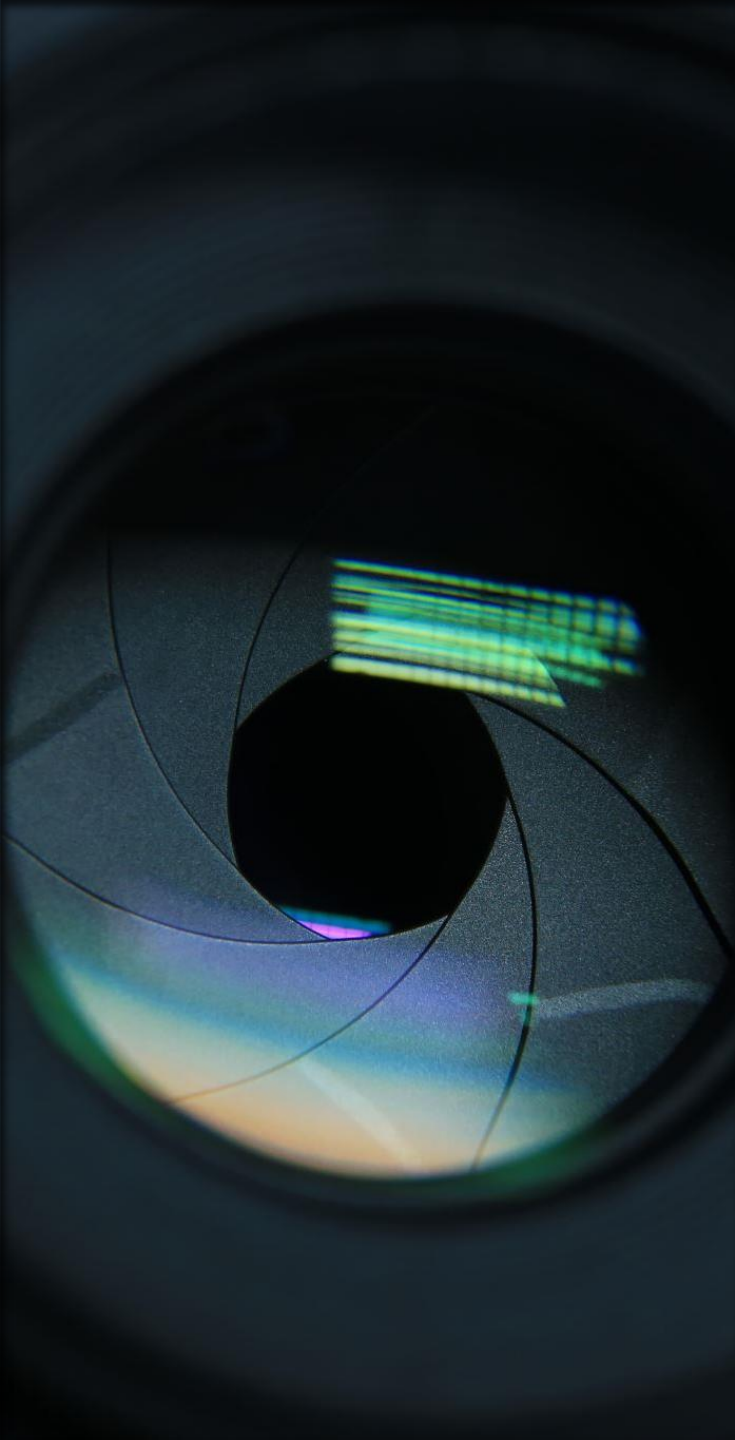
SCENE MODE (CONTINUED)





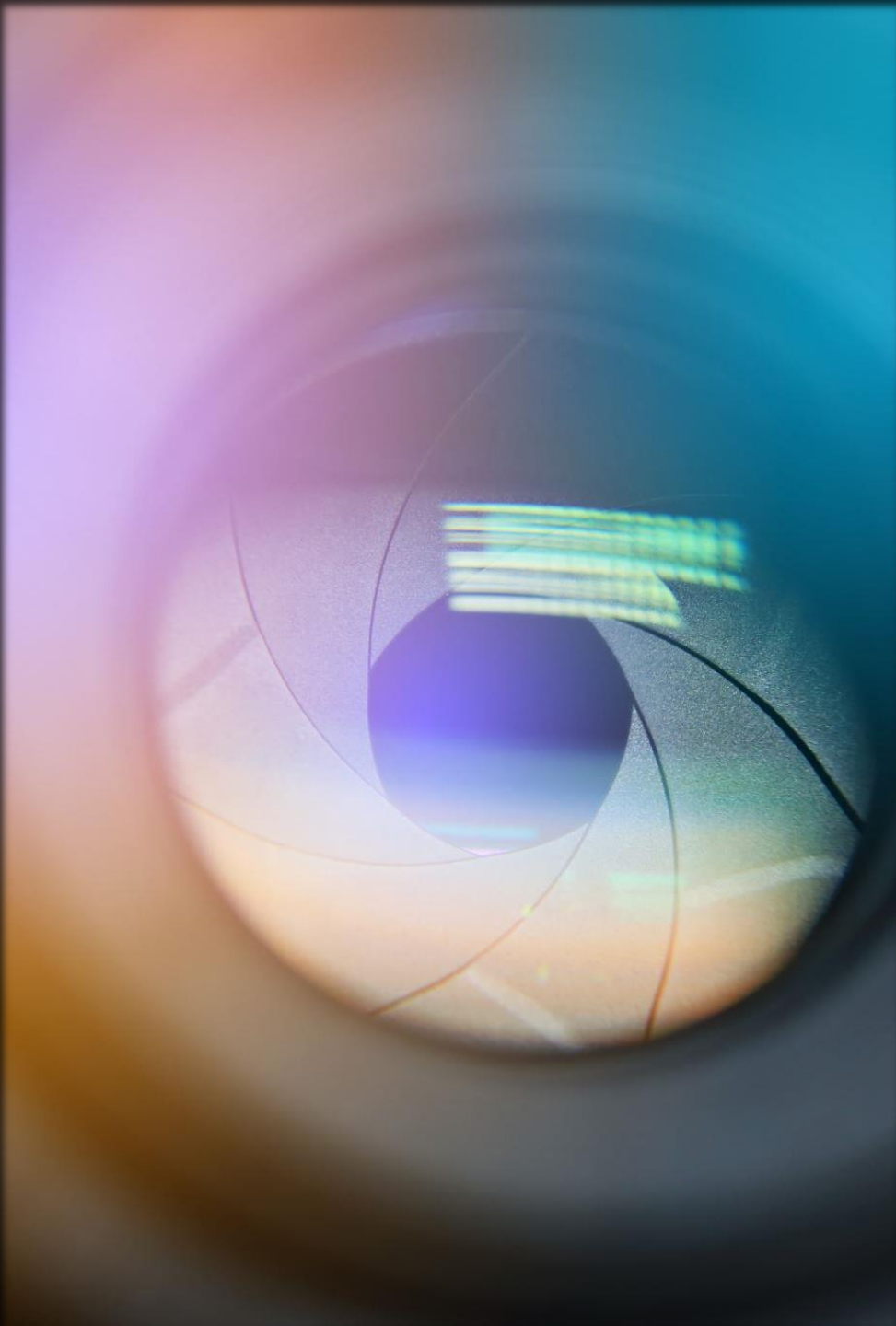
- ▶ Panning the camera from left to right slowly (in portrait or landscape orientation) and then the camera will stitch the photos together to produce a beautiful panoramic photograph.

PANARAMIC MODE.



The camera will set the speed, aperture and ISO depending on the scene. But you have the option of changing them to suit desired effect.

P – PROGRAM AE



A – APERTURE PRIORITY

Controls the various apertures depending on the scene you are taking and the desired effect.





S – SHUTTER PRIORITY

Controls the speed of the shutter.



- ▶ You set the shutter speed, aperture and ISO to your specification.

M – MANUAL MODE





- ▶ Designed for complete beginners, the camera will set up everything for you, depending on the scene being taken.

IA – INTELLIGENT AUTO

- ▶ There are different effects and filters that can be taken and added to the photo.
- ▶ Here are some of the effects.
- ▶ Expressive Retro Old Days High Key
- ▶ Low Key Sepia Dynamic Monochrome
- ▶ Impressive Art High Dynamic Cross Process
- ▶ Toy Effect Miniature Effect Soft Focus Star Filter
- ▶ One Point Colour
- ▶ On zoom compact cameras there is a switch that turns from right to left to zoom in and out.

CREATIVE CONTROL



- ▶ Some advanced compact camera have these modes.
- ▶ This will save your favourite settings so you can set the camera up immediately after switching it on.
